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Joyful Beginnings is an online community providing support, resources, and a sense of belonging to all those who share their lives with young children, pre-birth to age three.


At Joyful Beginnings parents benefit from the knowledge and expertise of experienced Early Childhood Educators, but more importantly they can learn from and lean on each other.

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WHAT IS THE DEVELOPMENTAL APPROACH?

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 The developmental approach to understanding our children (and ourselves) is a piece of the Maturation Theory of human growth and development. Using the lens of development as we look at our children, we understand their growth, changes, and behaviors

1) All children are born with innate potential as human beings.

2)It is our nature to mature- therefore it is a [©] spontaneous unfolding. It does not need to be taught [©] but it is also not inevitable.

3)The primary factor that limits maturation
(immaturity) is stuckness in one or more areas.





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WO DIFFERENT APPROACHES

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approaches major • There two are to understanding human development. Both have roots in psychology, but they have very different ways of understanding human development. The Behavioral approach looks at every human action as a learned behavior that sometimes needs to be corrected. The Developmental Approach looks at every human action as an unfolding of abilities at a given time. The chart below outlines some of the key differences as they relate to parenting.
